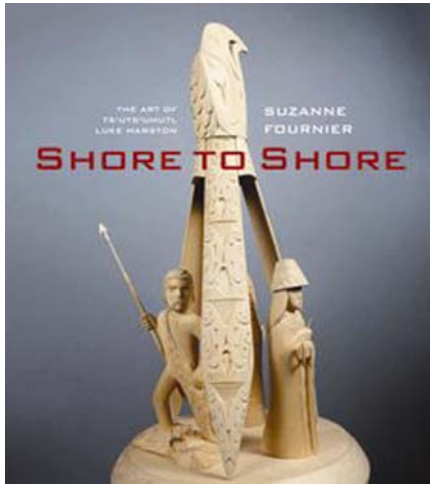

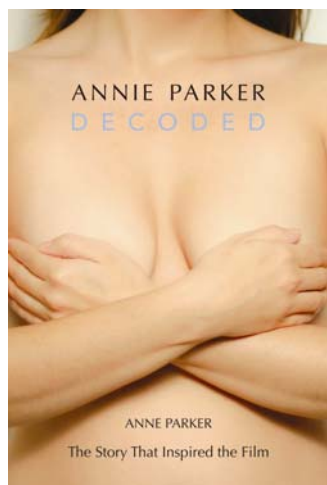
Stanley Park, Vancouver, September 2014. A fourteen-foot bronze-cast cedar sculpture is being erected. Dignitaries from all levels of government are present, including leaders of the Coast Salish First Nations and representatives from Portugal's Azores Islands. Luke Marston, carver/artist, supervises as his three-year project is revealed to the world. Combining interviews, research and creative non-fiction narration, author Suzanne Fournier recounts Marston's career, from his early beginnings carving totems for the public at the Royal BC Museum, to his study under Haida artist Robert Davidson and jewelry master Valentin Yotkov, to his visits to both his ancestral homes: Reid Island and the Portuguese Azores island of Pico—journeys which provided inspiration for the Shore to Shore statue.

Suzanne Fournier is a journalist who has been working with and writing about First Nations for over forty years. She was a reporter with the Vancouver Province for thirty-five years and her work has also appeared in the Globe and Mail, Maclean's magazine, the Toronto Star and other Canadian magazines and newspapers. Fournier has also appeared on CBC radio and television, and has contributed to US and German documentary television programs. She co-authored *Stolen From Our Embrace: The Abduction of First Nations Children and the Restoration of Aboriginal Communities*, which won the Hubert Evans Non-Fiction Prize in 1998. She divides her time between Galiano Island and Vancouver, BC.

In 2008, Steven Bernstein, an award-winning cinematographer, met Annie Parker. He was inspired by her story to direct and write *Decoding Annie Parker* (2013). The film follows the journey of Canadian Annie Parker (played by Samantha Morton) who learns she has breast cancer, the disease to which she lost her mother and sister. While Annie is struggling with the physical and emotional impact of her illness, she is convinced that there must be some hereditary connection for the cancer that devastated her family.

In the USA, geneticist Dr. Mary-Claire King (Helen Hunt) is researching the still unidentified link between DNA and cancer. *Decoding Annie Parker* depicts the heartbreaking struggle of battling breast cancer and the scientific dedication that led to the revolutionary 1990 breakthrough of the identification of the BRCA1 gene, responsible for many breast and ovarian cancers.

Annie Parker lost both her mother and sister to breast cancer at an early age. She has also survived three different cancers and now actively promotes awareness and genetic testing.

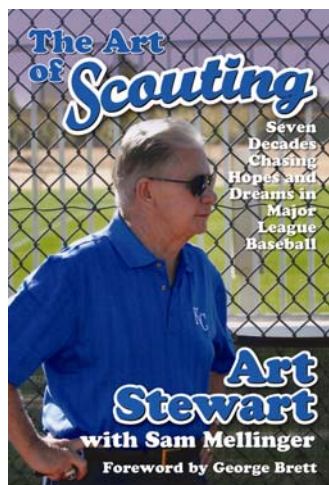
Having survived both breast (1980) and ovarian (1988) cancer, in 1994 Annie and other family members were among a small group of North American families tested for the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes. After waiting almost two years, she learned that she does carry the gene mutation. After surviving a further bout of cancer in 2005, Anne is today a 63-year-old, healthy woman living with a ticking time bomb, the BRCA1 gene mutation.

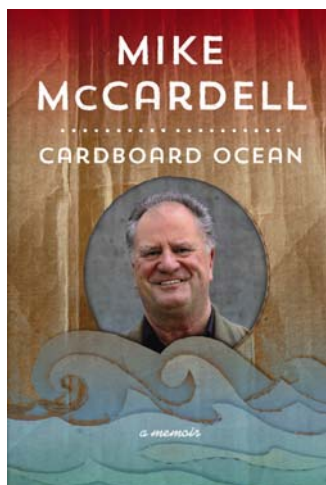

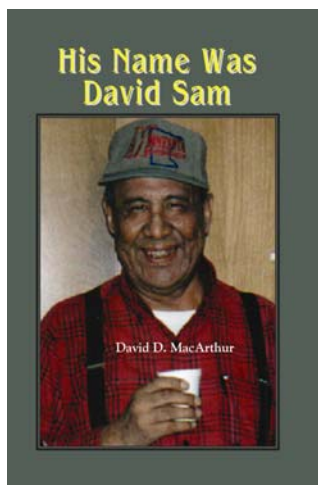

Dennis A . Demarchi was awarded the Association of Professional Biologists of British Columbia's Award of Excellence (now called the Ian McTaggart-Cowan Award of Excellence in Biology) for spearheading the development of the British Columbia wildlife habitat classification and ecoregion classification systems.

From the Dakota's loss of lands, encroachments by whites, embezzlement and questionable annuity dealings, the clash of cultures, starvation, drought, and previous conflicts, the tensions reached a climax. All these factors brought on war. This uprising would take over 600 white lives and an unknown number of Dakota. Stearns County was spared the bulk of the massacres, which mostly centered around the Minnesota River Valley. However, its people were still affected by the events taking place a short distance away. This book tells of the people and places in Stearns County affected by the Dakota Uprising of 1862, information found in museums and historical societies and other sources.
